Plarachterization: Intersection of Plot and Character

According to Mohr, the best plots aren't controlled by an authorial presence. Plot springs from the characters themselves. The writer masterminds all, but the more we move, the more we program ourselves to think of plot in this way: that our protagonists are sovereign beings with consciousnesses independent from our own—and the better prepared we are to traverse what he calls "plarachterization."

This seminar will be geared around characters' decision making, the causality between plot points, and how to keep a reader excitedly flipping pages. We'll also delve into specific tactics for constructing a present action and how to fold backstory into it. Plarachterization is a strategy that will help any aspiring writer.

<u>Joshua Mohr</u> is the author of four novels, including <u>Damascus</u>, which The New York Times called "Beat-poet cool." He has also written <u>Fight Song</u> and <u>Some Things that Meant the World to Me</u>, one of *O Magazine*'s top 10 reads of 2009 and a San Francisco Chronicle best-seller, as well as <u>Termite Parade</u>, an Editors' Choice on The New York Times best seller list. His novel <u>All This Life</u> is due out summer 2015 from Counterpoint/Soft Skull.
