Ever have ideas about stories that should be collected into an anthology? Why not work toward your stories being published in anthologies? Victoria will share her knowledge on writing and how to pursue an anthology publisher.

Background: Victoria's authorship includes *The Bone Weaver* (a novel); *More Than A Poet's Daughter: The Story of Ada Byron Lovelace*; and *Where Birds Never Sang: Sachsenhausen and Ravensbruck Concentration Camps* (airing on PBS in 2012). She has also edited anthologies with stories by Jane Smiley, Alan Dershowitz, and Joyce Maynard, among many others. She teaches creative nonfiction in the UCLA Writers' Program. In 2010, Victoria was named a 2010 San Francisco Library Laureate.
